A complete entry consists of the following requirements:

- 1. Entry form filled out completely
- 2. Photocopy of Negative Coggins Test dated within 36 months prior to the Fair
- 3. Photocopy of Veterinarian's Certificate for proof of annual rabies.

Show Rules

- 1. All entries must be between the ages of 8 and 19 years old and must pre-register through the Show Secretary as listed below.
- 2. Photocopies of a Negative Coggins test dates within 36 months prior to the Fair and a Veterinarian's Certificate for proof of annual rabies are required to be sent with your registration form.
- 3. No stallions or miniature horses.
- 4. Classes 1 through 19 except class 4 will be judged under the Danish system and the following premiums will be awarded: Blue \$17, Red 14, White \$12. Participants are judged individually and all participants are awarded a ribbon.
- 5. Money prizes will be awarded in classes 20 through 25 as follows: 1st \$5, 2nd-\$4, 3rd-\$3, 4th-\$2, 5th-\$1
- 6. ASTM/SEI helmets and appropriate attire are required of all riders.
- 7. Show committee may scratch, amend or combine classes at their discretion. Class Divisions: W/T All Ages (May not switch to cantering classes) Junior......ages 8-13
 Senior.....ages 14-19 Open...can be ridden English or Western
- 8. All entrants must participate in Showmanship Class in order to earn premiums and the Showmanship scores will be used to break any ties.
- 9. A rider may enter one horse per class.
- 10. Lunging will take place within the ring prior to the show and at lunch break.
- 11. Holds will be 3 minutes.
- 12. Horses must not be left unattended.
- 13. Every exhibitor must show all paperwork listed above to the show secretary at the Fair if requested to do so. Note: Must Meet Livestock Exhibitor Rules as listed in the Fair Book.
- 14. Horses may only walk when outside the show ring.

The Danish System

The Danish System, requires that each competitor be compared to a predetermined standard of excellence and awarded a blue, red, or white ribbon based on those standards. In the Danish System, exhibitors within a class are never compared to one another as they are judged under the standard ranking system. Since participants are judged against a set of criteria on an individual basis, not against other participants, it is possible for each participant in a class to earn a blue ribbon. A "First Blue" ribbon is awarded to the best of the blue ribbon winners. Blue Ribbon - Outstanding or Excellent Work. The exhibitor has met and/or exceeded basic requirements of the class. One or two minor faults, if immediately corrected, do not eliminate an exhibitor from the blue ribbon category. Red Ribbon - Good Work. An exhibitor completed the required work but with an accumulation of faults; missed leads, broken gaits, excessive speed, lack of coordination, poor equitation, poor grooming, or dirty or poor fitting tack. White Ribbon - Needs Improvement. An exhibitor completed the class but with some major faults or broken patterns; inability to execute and maintain required gait or performing in wrong lead without attempting to correct it.
